1. Postal Arrangements.

The postal address is : c/o Lundy Field Society, Lundy, Bristol Channel, via Bideford, North Devon.

The telegraphic address is : Lundy, via Hartland Point. Telegrams may be sent to or from Lundy. There is no telephonic communication.

Letters from Lundy must go through the Island Post Office and should not be handed to passengers for posting on the mainland.

2. Transport and Accommodation.

Weather and other circumstances permitting, the M.V. *Lerina* sails from Bideford, or sometimes Appledore or Clovelly, the time and port of departure being governed by the state of the tide. If it is necessary to stay overnight in Bideford information about suitable hotels may be obtained from either the Accommodation Officer or Mr. Gade. Last minute enquiries in Bideford should be directed to the master of the *Lerina*, Mr. A Hooper, 36, Market Street, Appledore (Tel. No. by day, Bideford 468), with whom also passages may be booked. The return fare is 25/-.

During late Spring and Summer, Campbell steamers may call at Lundy on two, or three, days in the week. Information about dates and times of these sailings may be had either from the Accommodation Officer, or direct from the Company at either

Prospective visitors to the Old Light must :

- (a) discover from the Accommodation Officer whether accommodation will be available for them during the period of the proposed visit—giving names of all in the party and the period desired ;
- (b) book passages on whichever boat is selected for the crossing, with either Mr. F. W. Gade, Lundy, Bristol Channel, via Bideford, or Mr. A. Hooper, 36, Market Street, Appledore, for the *Lerina* ; with Messrs. P. & A. Campbell, Ltd., at one of the above addresses, for the steamer.
- (c) notify the Accommodation Officer of the date and estimated time of arrival of their boat.

The Society will not hold itself responsible for boat bookings, and any cancellation or change of passage must be negotiated direct, and notified at the same time to the Accommodation Officer.

3. Sleeping Accommodation.

Dormitory sleeping accommodation is provided at the Old Light, but married couples can usually be accommodated together. Camp beds and blankets are provided.

4. Domestic Arrangements.

Domestic Arrangements are in charge of the Warden. Visitors are, however, asked to note that he is but one man, with scientific work to do for the Society, in addition to his other duties. The household work must therefore be shared by all. It includes laying meals, washing up, preparing vegetables, etc., sweeping and cleaning house, carrying water and domestic waste. Given willing co-operation no one is called upon to give an excessive amount of time to such work.

5. Rationing.

It is essential to take Ration Books with the correct points, etc., for the period, i.e. all coupons, including tea coupons, and seven points per week. It is illegal to take rationed goods instead of the coupons.

6. Equipment.

The following equipment is suggested :—

Warm clothing, with rain(wind-)proof topclothes. Laundry and drying facilities are limited, and adequate changes must be brought.

Gumboots.

Sheets or sheet-bag and pillow.

Towel and toilet gear, including soap.

Bathing suit if needed. Haversack, torch and spares, thermos flask.

Glasses and/or telescope, compass, pocket barometer.

Camera, etc., microscope and instruments if required.

Collecting equipment if desired.

Books, particularly for reference, except in the better known groups ; also such general reading as is desired.

Personal medicaments

(First Aid Equipment provided).

Notebook, writing paper, postage stamps, etc.

The charge for accommodation is 9/- per day inclusive, payable to the Treasurer, Mr. J. E. Moore, Clareville, 23, Upper Redlands Road, Reading, Berks.
